Economic Education Center Makes and Impact

On Friday, June 14, the Economic Education Center, which is part of the Plaster College of Business and Entrepreneurship, engaged 40 high school students in a financial education experience that also gave them a taste of college life at Lindenwood.



The center partnered with the Higher Education Consortium of Metropolitan St. Louis (HERC) to reach high school students in HERC's TRiO Educational Talent Search and TRiO Upward Bound programs. The students participated in the center's Mad City Money Financial Reality Simulation held in Harmon Hall. Students developed financial skills by experiencing what life can be like after high school as they take on the role of an adult with a family in the simulation. Students budgeted for monthly expenses, managed debts, and practiced saving for the future.

Grant Black, center director and associate professor of economics, said, "This was a fantastic experience that helped teach vital life skills to young people and showcased to a diverse group of local students what a great place Lindenwood is. We let them know they have a place here, where they can thrive after high school." This event highlights the creative outreach the center regularly does to provide economic and financial education to students throughout Lindenwood's surrounding community.
