Description of Work

In the first university I attended, my major was philosophy, not art. I was very interested in arts and followed some artists who taught me to paint during those four years. At that time I drew still life, land-scapes and figures, most of them in realistic style. I never tried other ways or directions, even though I knew various styles in modern art.

I think art goes beyond national boundaries, so
I came to American to see and learn more. In this year,
I have tried different ways to create my painting world
and to learn how to get inspirations from real life.
The changes in my paintings show that I have continued
to absorb, feel and get new ideas.

Western art and eastern art are totally different systems. I can understand Chinese wash drawings because I grew up in a Chinese cultural society, but I also live in a modern time. Modern art has so many different styles, and I wanted to know their developments and features in order to create my own style. It is very important to me to be a painter. Opening the mind to get new stimuli is a good way to improve.

This time I have put eleven works into the thesis exhibition. They present my changes in this year: what I have learned, tried and accomplished. They are not of any exact style because I tried different ways to express my ideas. I get inspirations from my classes, other people's works, TV, newspapers, magazines and things that are in my life.

The Autumn View and Fall were done during the beginning of last semester. I painted them in the same way as I had before. They are of the impressionistic style, and show good weather and autumn's colorful fields. I try to express the seasonal feeling and multitude of colors. It is totally different from Taiwan's autumn where I live because the trees are green throughout the year.

Still Life is influenced by Henri Matisse. I saw some of his originals and was attracted by the decorative style, simplied form and powerful colors. In this work I kept the panel in its original vivid colors, and did not overly describe each objects. What I wanted was to create a simplified, explicit effect.

Out of the Window is a winter's work. The window was frozen. Through the semitransparent surface, the

sunset was gorgeous. The value and color of its light were so various, I tried to express the feeling I received.

The Figure is my new attempt at Cubism. I changed the objects' shapes but did not destroy the structures. The subject and background are still complete. I kept the whole picture in a brown tone.

In <u>The Body is the Prison of the Soul</u> I got the inspiration from my drawing class. The model stood in a cage-like wooden structure, and looked like a limited person who is thinking about how to get free. I used strong, contrasting colors to imply the enormous pressure and struggle in his mind. In fact, the real prison is the material limitation.

Self Portrait is also the Qubism style. I used soft, light colors in the subject. The varied grey background made the figure very obvious.

Taiwan is a sea island. It is easy to see the sea. Fishermen catch fishes at night. The lights in the dark sea gave me a very strong impression. In The Lights of Fishing Boats I tried to express the peaceful, romantic feeling. The bright lights look like stars in the sky.

Curves crossed the panel, meaning sea breezes from every every side.

Chinese new year is in lunar January. In this time they will stick scrolls upon which are written good wishes beside the gate. Generally the scrolls' shape is a long rectangle or square which puts on the top. I planned a door image in Congratulations for Chinese New Year. The little square implies a scroll. Red color is the traditional Chinese lucky color, so I painted them in red to express the new years' atmosphere.

In The Colors of the Sea, I used a narrow, long panel to imply the deep of the sea. I painted with arcylic paints and water to create a transparent effect.

Above is all of my works from this year. They are records of my learning process. I will work harder and continue to search for my own style.
