New Education Degrees Launching this Fall

Lindenwood University has announced plans to launch new graduate degree programs beginning in the fall of 2011 through the School of Education. The additional programs include master of arts degrees in education with three different emphases options, a master's degree in teachers of English to speakers of other languages (TESOL) with a certification option, and an educational specialist degree in instructional leadership with two options for specialization.

The new areas of emphasis from which students may choose when pursuing a master's degree in education include English for second language learners with certification, early interventions in autism and sensory impairments, and K-5 mathematics education.

The master's program in TESOL is designed for those who wish to teach English as a second language to students outside of the standard K-12 setting, while the certification option is for current K-12 teachers who wish to add it to their existing credentials.

The two specialization options offered through the educational specialist degree in instructional leadership are mathematics education specialist and K-12 reading literacy specialist.
