Sir,

I wrote you on the 1<sup>t</sup>. of March last advising you of my having directed J. G. Comegys & C<sup>o</sup>. to pay you Seventy five Dollars for me on account of the hire of your Negro Boy Bock, which you have no doubt Received ere this. I now enclose you my Dft: on Gen<sup>1</sup>. Clark for Thirty-Seven Dollars, which is in full for the Kire of your Boy up to an including the 15<sup>th</sup>. of this month, about which time you will probably Receive the Boy. I Shall leave here in a few days to be absent ab<sup>t</sup>. 2 Months, if the Contractor's Boat Should not arrive before I Start (by which I Shall Send your Boy down) I Shall leave directions for him to be Sent down in her and left at Capt. Wherry's at S<sup>t</sup>. Charles. Any errors in the amount between us can be adjusted when I See you again.

Please to tender my Comp<sup>ts</sup>. to Mrs. C. and believe me to be Sir Yr. ver. Ob<sup>t</sup>. Sy<sup>t</sup>.
