Culture Connection is a Professional Learning Community (PLC) designed to welcome new employees and help them immerse themselves in Lindenwood's vibrant culture. Offered by the Learning Academy each fall and spring, this PLC provides a rich introduction to the values, resources, and initiatives that define Lindenwood.



This fall marked the ninth cohort of Culture Connection, and over six weeks, participants engaged with campus leaders and programs. They met with the President's Cabinet, explored the principles of Design Thinking, and participated in high-performance team training.
