This being the very first opportunity afforded me to have it conveyed to the office since receiving the first. I hope the delay will have no serious effect in procastinating the yet unsetled business of the late commissioners of the Mexican Road. I sign with pleasure the enclosed and sincerely hope it meets the prompt attention of the government. Every laudable effort on my part shall be used to bring this matter to a speedy and satisfactory close. From a conversation with Mr. Petties shortly before he set out for the city of "ashington I am pursuaded he will use his best efforts to procure the amount justly due the commissioners.
