2025 Region 6 Science Olympiad Held on Campus

Lindenwood successfully hosted the Region 6 [Science Olympiad](#) competitions on campus on February 22 and March 1. Over 500 middle and high school students were on campus participating in the events coming from 20 area schools.

Science Olympiad is a national competition that was founded in 1984 and teams of 15 students participate in 23 different STEM-based events at regional, state, and national tournaments.

The event is run completely by volunteers, of which they give up their time and weekend to help the kids have fun competing. There were 60 unique volunteers that helped make this event a success. The volunteers come from a variety of sources, however LU faculty and students made up my largest percentage of volunteers from a single source. Volunteers also came from Boeing, Ameren, Southwest Airlines, Eurofins, American Concrete Institute, Ilant Health, area retirees and friends of friends that see the value of this type of program and helped for the day.

Ladue Middle school and Ladue Horton Watkins High School placed first. The other middle school teams that will be advancing to state are Wydown, Sperreng, and John Burroughs. The other high school teams are John Burroughs, Marquette, Clayton, and Parkway West High. Good luck to these teams as they advance to the state competition in April.
