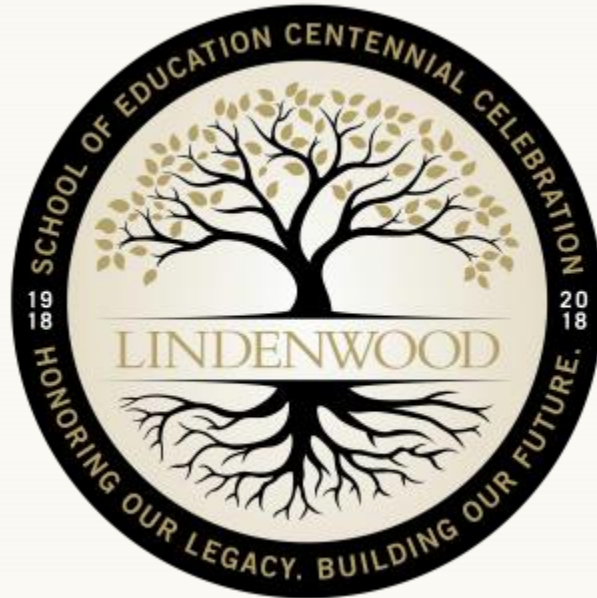

SCHOOL OF EDUCATION TO CELEBRATE CENTENNIAL NOV. 7-8

The Lindenwood University School of Education will be celebrating its centennial on Nov. 7-8 with a series of events and the theme “Honoring Our Legacy, Building Our Future.”

On Nov. 7, the School of Education welcomes a special guest speaker at the J. Scheidegger Center for the Arts’ Lindenwood Theater from 10:30 a.m. to noon. A diversity panel, focusing on the next 100 years at the School of Education, will be held in Dunseth Auditorium in Harmon Hall from 3 to 4:30 p.m.

Alumni and friends will gather Nov. 8 at 3:45 p.m. for a barbecue at the Lindenwood Pavilion and Courtyard. Guests must RSVP for the barbecue by Oct. 17.

Other events in the courtyard include a ceremonial planting of the “Promise Tree” and the burying of a time capsule. The capsule contains photos of School of Education faculty and staff, predictions from local elementary schools on what they expect schools and the world to be like in 100 years, and Lindenwood clothing and merchandise. Guests can also take a tour of Roemer Hall, which includes a look into the “Future-Ready Classroom” and the unveiling of the “Centennial Wall.”
