Lindenwood University's Supply Chain Management program was recently recognized by two ranking agencies for its bachelor's and MBA degrees.

Lindenwood ranks number 19 as one of the Best Online Bachelor's in Supply Chain Management for 2019 by BestColleges.com. This is the second year in a row the program has been selected. The Robert W. Plaster School of Business and Entrepreneurship at Lindenwood offers an undergraduate business administration program with an emphasis in supply chain management, where students can choose to pursue either a B.A. or a B.S. degree.
