




Over the summer, Lindenwood has been working to complete four major updates and improvements to certain areas of campus. These improvements will not only enhance the University but also the overall student experience by providing more options and opportunities on campus.

In anticipation for the upcoming Division I athletics season, a state-of-the art video display board will be installed in Harlen C. Hunter Stadium. The board will have the ability to display scores and instant replays.

For those who are looking for a place to work out, Lindenwood is projected to have the Evans Commons Fitness Center renovations completed before students return for the fall semester. The new fitness center will replace the current out-of-date fitness center and will have a modern feel with state-of-the-art equipment.

As the University continues to grow, it is important to expand dining options to meet students' needs and expectations. With the new enhanced dining options, students will enjoy more local dining partnerships, new and expanded dining technology, an all-you-can-eat option in the Evans Commons dining hall, a wider variety of nutritional and healthy options, and upgraded serving stations and menu items.
