LINDENWOOD PLANS SESQUICENTENNIAL FAIR OCT. 22-23

"Between Yesterday and Tomorrow" will be the theme of The Lindenwood Colleges' Sesquicentennial Fair to be held Oct. 22 and 23 on the St. Charles campus. Sponsored by the Women's Association of The Lindenwood Colleges (WALC), with Mrs. William C. Spencer as chairperson, the fair will be held in conjunction with Lindenwood's founding 150 years ago.

Mrs. Spencer says the purpose of the two-day event will be to provide an enjoyable and exciting adventure in community participation, and to raise funds for the new Student Activities Center soon to be built on the Lindenwood campus. Lindenwood's Founders' Day is also being planned in conjunction with the fair.

Plans are underway to designate Oct. 22 as The Lindenwood Colleges Sesquicentennial Day for the city of St. Charles. Residents of St. Charles and the metropolitan St. Louis area are invited to share in the festivities.

A parade on Oct. 22 consisting of students dressed as George and Mary Sibley, Lindenwood founders; horsedrawn carriages; antique autos; the banners of Lindenwood's four colleges; a marching band; clowns and nursery school children in a futuristic rocket; will begin at the Missouri Riverfront on Main Street in St. Charles at 9:30 a.m., proceeding west on Jefferson Street to The Colleges.

Exhibits and shops on display will include: a Lindenwood/St. Charles History, a "Christmas in October Shop," a House Plant Bazaar, an Old-Fashioned Bakery and Gourmet Shop, and original art and merchandise will be auctioned in the Frontier Trading Post. A "Future World" will feature the marvels of technology, and the Lindenwood Theatre Department will perform the musical, "Godspell." Snacks will be available, as well as pony rides and games for the children.

Volunteers from the community are needed to work in every activity, and contributions such as handcrafts, artwork, toys, needlework, baked goods, house plants, antiques, bric-a-brac, and household accessories such as small appliances, dishes, coffee mugs, ash trays, lamps, etc., are needed.
