St. Charles, Missouri -- The Art Department of The Lindenwood Colleges and the Missouri State Council on the Arts are sponsoring a series of workshops on color beginning October 19 and running for 5 consecutive Saturdays through November 16. The workshops will be held in Room 210 of the Fine Arts Building on the Lindenwood campus and will begin at 9:30 a.m. and end at noon. The workshops will be directed by Ms. Mary Fifield, instructor of Art at Forest Park Community College, where she teaches design, color, composition, and drawing.

Ms. Fifield received her Master of Fine Arts degree from Pratt Institute in New York where she also had a teaching internship. She has received a number of honors and awards including a Ford Foundation Grant for a faculty fellowship in the Humanities in 1971. A tuition fellowship at the Positano, Italy Art Workshop was awarded to her in 1970. She has an extensive exhibition record.

The main objective of these workshops is to aid participants in developing a sensitive eye for color relatedness and color use through their own experimentation. Part of the workshops will be devoted to practical and specific color projects which demonstrate the relationship between color theory and practice. A series of informal lectures will supplement the studio exercises.

The following schedule has been devised for meeting the above objectives and any person interested should plan to attend all five workshops.

October 19. Color: Its Basic Characteristics and Language

October 26. Color Science: Relationship of Light to Color

November 2. Color Theorists: The Principles behind Color Practice

November 9. Palettes of the Past: History of Color in Painting

November 16. Description of Deception: Use of Color in Contemporary Art
