An exhibit of drawings, embossings and offset lithographs by Winslow Crannell will be shown in the main gallery of the Fine Arts Building on the Lindenwood Colleges' campus beginning today, October 31, and continuing through November 24. Mr. Crannell will speak at 11 a.m., Wednesday, November 20, in room 101 of the Fine Arts Building and the public is invited to view his exhibit and attend the November 20 lecture.

Winslow Crannell, a native of Albany, New York, has been assistant professor of art at North Georgia College in Dahlonega, Georgia since 1971. He holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in painting and a Master of Fine Arts degree in graphic arts (drawing and printmaking) from Florida State University. At North Georgia College he instructs courses in drawing, printmaking, photography, painting and art history. In addition, he travels with his art work to various regional art shows and has been awarded numerous awards for both his realistic and abstract pencil drawings and embossings.

Mr. Crannell's favorite subjects are structures such as old barns and housesremnants of a simpler time that tell their tales of neglect and age. It is the
