Miss Zimmerman, a native of Hamburg, Germany, has an extensive background of training, performance, touring, and teaching. After ten years with two ballet companies in Germany, during which time she rose to the rank of soloist, she came to the United States to study modern dance technique with Martha Graham. She has also performed in numerous operas, operettas, and for various television stations.

Since 1967, she has toured the U.S. and Germany as soloist, lecturer, and guest artist. In 1970 she started her own studio in New York and formed her own company--The Kammertanz (Chamber Dance) Theater. She has recently been a visiting lecturer at several prominent universities and colleges throughout the country, including a one-year residency at Washington University in St. Louis and the University of Wisconsin. She is presently the chairman of the dance program at the University of North Carolina in Charlotte.

Miss Zimmerman's week at Lindenwood will offer many opportunities for the St. Charles and St. Louis area. In addition to the dance classes, master classes, and

lecture-demonstrations which are all open to the public, a special master class for St. Charles and metro-area high school students will be given Thursday, November 14, from 4 to 5:30 p.m. That evening there will be a lecture-demonstration, open to the public, entitled "Reflections on Contemporary Modern Dance," from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m.

The Lindenwood Colleges invite the community to attend the week's events-a master class at 7 p.m. on Monday night, November 11; the lecture-demonstration
on Thursday night, November 14, at 7 p.m.; and the performance at 8 p.m. on Friday,
