Charles O. Hartman, visiting poet at The Lindenwood Colleges for the week of April 14 - 18, is a specialist in the poetry of popular song lyrics. His lectures and seminars, in addition to presentation of his own poetry, will include performances and discussion of the lyrics of Joni Mitchel and Bob Dylan.

"A song," says Hartman, "is the integration (not the mere combination) of words and music." The public lecture scheduled for 8 p.m. Tuesday, April 15, in Jelkyl Center for the Performing Arts at Lindenwood will deal with that idea. Members of the audience will receive copies of the lyrics of Joni Mitchell's "Michael from Mountains" and Bob Dylan's "Don't Think Twice, It's All Right" to enable them to follow the discussion.
