D^r. Sir

We have for some time had a parcell of Medals on hand at the mint under the direction of John Vaughan Esq/ Philad^a. ~ when I left that place he told me he calculated on having a considerable part of them finished in a few days and promised to send them on by mail as fast as they were finished - from my not hearing from him since my return, I fear something has occurred to retard the work. These medals are immediately wanted to forward with a parcell of Goods now in readiness to be forwarded to several Indian tribes - calculating on your still being in ~~Philadelphia~~ Philad^a. - I have taken the liberty of asking the favor of your calling on Mr. Vaughan for whom I enclose you a letter - should you be returning this way in a few days I would be much obliged by your bringing on some of the medals with you - if not please urge Mr. Vaughan

to have them all finished and sent on as fast as possible - If we do not receive them in a few days they will be too late for the goods now ready to be sent off. I am & - & - & -
